Rusty Edwards is recognized for managing and curating the 1st Generation Colt Single Action Army (SAA) Revolver Serial Number List, which is available as a downloadable document from swshana.com. He has compiled information on thousands of 1st Generation Colt SAA revolvers, focusing on those with notable provenance or connections to outlaws, lawmen, actors, military units, and other prominent owners through history. ^[1] ^[2] ^[3]

Background and Activities

- **Role:** Rusty Edwards is acknowledged as the compiler and manager of the most widely referenced list of 1st Generation Colt SAA revolvers, specifically tracking serial numbers and provenance details. ^[2] ^[3]
- **Community Presence:** He uses the handle "Ruster" in online forums and regularly invites collectors and researchers to contribute verified provenance and serial data to improve and expand the list. ^[4] ^[2]

- **Contact:** Edwards is responsive to community inquiries and welcomes submissions of additional Colt SAA information that can be substantiated by documents like Colt Letters, Kopec Authentication Letters, published articles, and museum or family provenance. ^[4]

- **Importance:** The 1st Generation Colt SAA Serial Number List managed by Rusty Edwards serves as a historic registry for enthusiasts and historians, detailing ownership and historical context for American Old West-period firearms. ^[3] ^[1] ^[2]
- **Availability:** The list can be accessed directly via swshana.com as a public PDF resource for collectors and researchers. ^[1] ^[2]
